National Conference 2009 "The Pilgrim, the Path and the Goal."

Saturday 31st January 2009

400 delegates all gathered on a cold Saturday morning at a brand new venue for the National Conference (NC). The conference started with Vedam chanting and the inaugural lighting of the lamp by our special guests Dr Samuel and Mrs Sharon Sandweiss, followed by multifaith prayers. Irrespective of the particular faith, (there were several included), the feeling of devotion and sacred connection was the same from each prayer. We were then bathed and purified in a guided Meditation on Light (Jyoti).

Rosemary Perry, UK National Chair, setting the scene, explained how the UK Central Council (UKCC) of the Sai Organisation has been listening to our feedback and is gradually implementing changes in response to this including:

- 1) The recent 'Handbook for Office Bearers' that answers most of the typical questions we have about organisation matters and came out last autumn with much input from the centres and Groups.
- 2) Moving to a new venue for the NC to try and reduce the cost for families attending whilst also opening the NC out for all members of the organisation and not just 'office bearers'.
- 3) The programme now has more of a satsang feel rather than the workplan / workshops of the past again, as a result of listening to feedback.

She also threaded through her talk aspects about her own path, its unfolding and the growing recognition that the only true journey leads within.

We saw the humanness of our UKCC members when we watched a video of interviews (and some hilarious outtakes!) of National Wing Coordinators and Regional Chairs sharing 2008 highlights and their plans for 2009. It was an opportunity to acknowledge the hard work of UKCC members, to thank members stepping down as well as to welcome new members. The UKCC members leaving were each presented with a signed copy of one of Dr Sandweiss' books by him.

Ishver Patel, our Central Coordinator, spoke about what is happening internationally within the Sai Organisation, explaining that there is a drive to consolidate and have a coherent strategy. He mentioned how much international information is available on http://www.sathyasai.org

Ishver also talked about developments at the Sathya Sai School in Leicester and showed us pictures of the building that is being currently considered as a possible new home for it.

He then updated delegates on the 'National Archive' project. [See article on Page 4 of this issue of 'Love and Light'. - Ed.]

Both Rosemary and Ishver highlighted that there is no need to 'take Swami's message out' - rather our role is to BE Swami's message in the world. We were all given a challenge by Ishver to stop living on 'Sai Island' and to get 'out there' and help address with our immediate families, needs "What neighbours and communities. difference are we making by our existence?" he asked. "What use is it if we don't put any of Sai Baba's teachings into practice? We have secured this journey, this opportunity to be alive while God walks on earth, but have we made any attempt to understand the path we're treading? What is the goal? Is the goal the end? We find that in fact, the path becomes the goal and we merge with the

Photographs and films from activities at National, Regional, and Centre/Group level across the UK were woven together in a beautiful and moving film running chronologically, month by month, through 2008. The film made the audience laugh, as well as cry (...or was it only me?) [No it moved many people to tears! Ed.] Thank you to everyone involved in contributing and putting the film together. We have some very skilled members in our organisation!

Carole Alderman, Director of BISSE (the British Institute of Sathya Sai Education) gave us an update of SSEHV activities. Did you know that Prashanti Bookshop has sold over 20,000 UK-developed SSEHV manuals and that the work is being translated into many different languages – including Spanish, French, Arabic and Mandarin? SSEHV is Sai Baba's gift to humanity and the vehicle by which human values will blossom in the hearts of the next generation... what an opportunity to get involved!

Sri Kandiah talked about the Sathya Sai Leadership Training Programme (SSLTP). SSLTP focuses 80% on BEING rather than doing, seeing or telling. It is who we are 'being' at any time, in any situation, that is

most important – after all, that's why we are called human beings rather than human Participants from current cohort doings! Project Group 1 then shared some of their research findings with us all. Their project is looking at 'The Office Bearer Role - Spiritual Deterrent or Transformational Tool?' and they have collated feedback from questionnaires that were sent out across the UK to all Centres and Groups. Many similarities between the views of current office bearers as well as non-office bearers were highlighted this gives much food for thought for the Sai Organisation!

As one of the Group travels from Switzerland to do the SSLTP training, there was comparable research done in some European Sai Organisations as well. The full report will be presented to the UKCC soon. [Please see more on the outcomes of this project in a later issue of 'Love and Light' – Ed.]

Throughout the day, in three 45-minute sessions, our guests from California, Dr Samuel (Sam) and Mrs Sharon Sandweiss entertained, moved and inspired us by sharing their own experiences of travelling along their personal pilgrimage paths. Sam amused us as he talked about the challenges he faced as a young psychiatrist, first returning from being in Sai Baba's presence, explaining to his colleagues that he had come to believe that not only is he himself God - but also everyone else is too!

Sharon told the story of a unique ring that Sai Baba had materialised for her. The ring had a very unusual symbol on it that, it transpired, represented the word 'God' in many different ways depending on how the ring was turned. But it was a complete surprise when Sharon discovered through the reaction of an Islamic supermarket assistant in Michigan that the ring spelled 'Allah' in Arabic script.

Since receiving the ring Sharon and Sam have had close contact with Muslims in the Eastern European countries, where the knowledge that Sai Baba materialised the word of Allah on a ring for a Jewish woman has had a profound effect!

Sharon and Sam also shared many enlightening stories about their children and grandchildren. For example, on the way home from nursery, Sam would chant the Gayatri mantra while his grandson slept in the car. One day, out of the blue, his grandson started saying the Gayatri – word for word! We have no idea about the impact of our actions on others - which is more reason to make sure our actions are based on love and truth and that we surrender the fruits!

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Other key points that Sam and Sharon emphasised: With love, man is God – the title of Sam's most recent book. The mind is the key – turned inward it can liberate - turned outward towards the world, it can bind. We should practice sense control. We should develop a relationship with Sai Baba whereby we see Sai Baba everywhere and talk to Sai constantly. We should bring the atmic Sai within into our community. And we should accept the purification process that we're going through!

Children from Mill Hill and Milton Keynes Centres moved us all with their melodious and sweet voices. They sang a wonderful uplifting mixture of devotional songs before Dr and Mrs Sandweiss offered Aarathi to Sai Baba. During his talk, Sam shared a very moving video interview with Jack Hislop while Jack was in hospital towards the end of his life. Sam asked Jack what the key message was after all his searching for God and research into so many different philosophies and faiths before he came to Sai Baba. Jack replied that, "Devotion to God is the key".

You and I are both God... then the pilgrim is God. Sai Baba says the path is about finding our true selves, i.e. God. Then the path is God. Devotion to God is the key... then the goal is God too! All is one and all is God.

- Group Activities for Nursery and Group 1 (Primary)


- Effective use of drama and storytelling in SSF

It is terrific that the UKCC plan to take 'Office Bearer Training Days' to the Regions has been broadened into: 'Regional ROAD Shows' (where 'ROAD' = 'Regional Organisation Awareness Day') and everyone from the Region's Centres and Groups may attend who is interested

The SSSSO UK National Archive

work in progress – and an opportunity for YOU to contribute!

Why have a National Archive - service activities personal are done for our transformation, not done for reports and certainly not done for write-ups! However, as an organisation, we need to have records of what we have done so we can, for example, feed into the World Education Conference exhibition in Prashanti, and so we can evaluate the benefit we provide. You may think your Group/Centre only feeds 30 people once a month but when you take into account all the Centres and Groups across the UK, it comes to a total of 45,000 meals served each year by members. Personally, I think this helps unite us in our activities and inspires us to serve more.

Where have we got to so far with archiving? Following pushes to record events around the

UK over the past few years, each Region should have someone nominated to collect photos, any newspaper cuttings, and reports. Perhaps each Centre/Group chairperson has records? What happens to these records? Are they handed over to successors? records most National Events. In addition, we are trying to back fill information. We have scanned the following: old issues of 'Facets', 'Sai Reflections', the 'Hatfield Newsletter', Newsletters from Eire, Scotland Newsletters' (Region 8), Quarterly Reports; and souvenir brochures from 1985 up to the present day. These have PDF converted into and documents so that the information can be used again and so it can be accessed more easily and by more people than the paper copies. The old SSE manuals have been scanned in as well, and recent photos have been labelled and stored on CDs. The next major task is cataloguing this so that it is easily searchable.

What more do we need? We are looking for reports, photos and newspaper cuttings about service work, spiritual projects, multifaith events etc. Things we do NOT want are old photos of Sai Baba or photos of 'usual' events such as devotional singing unless they are 'special' events e.g. involving many different communities or as part of a service project etc. There are also gaps in records for the above list of publications – if you have paper copies please contact me and ask if I need them to complete the set.

How can you help? Please contact me at archive@srisathyasai.org.uk if you think you have something that may be useful. I will advise what to do with it and where to send it. Things to think about are whether you want the originals returned, whether you can put things on a CD or DVD, and making sure photos are labelled with key information such as date, location, Region or Centre/Group, what the event is and any other key information (e.g. if the mayor or other VIP is present).

Looking forward to hearing from you... I just hope my postman is an understanding soul!
