Advent of Sathya Sai Baba

To commemorate the advent of Bhagawan's 85th Year. Please find below an article on the advent of the avatar from a discourse by Swami.



In olden days, it was a common practice among the women of Bharat (India) to perform the sacred ritual of Sathyanarayana Vratam, on every full moon day. Likewise, mother Easwaramma used to perform Sathyanarayana Vratam every full moon day in the company of Karanam Subbamma, who was her neighbour. Karanam Subbamma would often tell Easwaramma.

"You are performing Sathyanarayana Vratam. With His blessings, you will bear a son. I want you to name him Sathyanarayana."

On a particular full moon day, Easwaramma did not have food untill very late in the afternoon, since she was participating in the Sathyanarayana Vratam being performed in Subbamma's house. The family members, including her husband Pedda Venkama Raju, were very much upset to see her remain without food for such a long time. Pedda Venkama Raju argued that there was no need to observe such severe austerities. But Easwaramma was determined. She told them not to wait for her saying,


"I am not at all hungry. Sathyanarayana Vratam is more important for me than food."



After the ritual was completed, Subbamma brought prasadam (blessed food) for Easwaramma. Only after partaking of the prasadam did Easwaramma have her food that day. Women in those days used to perform such rituals with all sincerity and devotion. Only after partaking of prasadam could Easwaramma conceive.

Yad Bhavam Tad Bhavati (as is the feeling, so is the result).

Some people have faith in scriptural injunctions and adhere to them with earnestness, whereas some others ignore them. Easwaramma was the one who followed the injunctions strictly. Only after performing the vratam and partaking of the prasadam would she commence her household chores. She was unlettered. But she had unflinching faith in God.



Chanting Rudram

1. What is Rudram?

Rudram is a stotra dedicated to Lord Rudra (Shiva). It is taken from the fourth Kanda of the Taittirya Samhita Yajur veda. Rudram consists of two parts – Namakam and Chamakam. Namakam glorifies the different names, forms and attributes of the all-pervading cosmic form of Lord Shiva. This is very similar to Astothara Sahasranama that we perform in the name of our beloved Bhagawan. Chamakam is a prayer seeking physical, mental, spiritual and worldly benefits. Hence we first 'worship' the Lord by chanting the Namakam and then 'pray' for his grace by reciting the Chamakam.

2. What is the significance of chanting Rudram?

To put it in one line - it pleases Bhagawan Baba!

For the more technically minded - Chanting the Rudram is considered to be of great benefit. It is one of the most powerful stotras that is both a worship and a prayer. It is easy to learn the importance of Rudram by picking up few books, but the best way to understand its potency is to experience the power firsthand. None can deny the immense vibrations or elevating experience when they were present during the Athi Rudra yagnas at Puttaparthi. Similarly chanting any mantra, more importantly Rudram, enhances the spiritual vibrations immensely.

On more mundane terms, the words and syllables in the Rudram are so arranged as to evoke the best vibrations in the vicinity in which it is being chanted. Hence, any object, more so a person, who happens to listen to the Rudam being chanted is bound to be energised by the resonance effect that the sounds of the Rudram causes in him/her. It is a well documented fact that the effects encompass both mental tranquillity as well as general well being.

3. I do not know the meaning. Is it ok to chant?

Swami often uses the analogy of a lullaby and the way it puts a baby to sleep – though the baby can neither sing nor understand the meaning. In the same way, mere chanting of Vedas can bestow immense benefit on the person who chants and on his surroundings.

4. I listen to Rudram every day. Is that enough?

It is important to make an attempt to learn and chant any mantra for that matter. Swami says, 'The Vedas and Puranas (scriptures) deserve to be read and heard earnestly. God's Name should be recited and listened to devoutly. For some

ailments, medicines are prescribed either for external application or consumption. However, for this universal ailment of Bhavaroga (the cycle of birth and death), Shravanam (listening to the Glory of God) and Keertanam (reciting or singing the glory of God) are the medicines prescribed for internal and external use. Every aspirant must chant as well as listen to God's Name to receive His Grace."

5. What are Swami's words on Rudram?

Although Swami has spoken about the Vedas in several discourses he has chosen to highlight the importance of Rudram by action instead. The Athi Rudra Maha Yagnam that is conducted every year is an example. It is worthy of note, that in recent times Rudram is being chanted before the morning and evening darshans, and was even taught to everyone assembled in the Kulwant hall.

Swami has often asked primary school children to chant Rudram in front of all. He feels happy and proud (on a physical level!) when they do it and the same applies to all of us (His children) scattered across the globe.

The very fact that our Bhagawan chooses to shower His special attention over this one particular holy stotra, should suffice for us to take the hint and strive hard to learn it. It is but a great opportunity that Swami has thrown open to all His devotees, to play a cherished role in His divine mission.

6. Who can chant Rudram?

Swami has made it clear beyond doubt that any body can chant Vedas irrespective of their caste, creed, race, religion or nationality.

"Why SSEHV in preference to other "Values" Programmes?

Sathya Sai Education in Human Values (SSEHV) is a unique course for two reasons:

- The fundamental belief that five values are inherent in all of humanity
- The Guided Light Visualisation

The course does not aim to "teach" Human Values, but rather seeks to "bring out" the Core Human Values of Truth, Right Conduct, Peace, Love, and Non-Violence inherent in all Human Beings and in creation.

Many situations and experiments demonstrate this; e.g., the bond between a mother and child demonstrates easily the manifestation of innate love. Love can be projected from one to all and



was proven in an experiment conducted by Dr Jumsai's students who challenged the principle of innate love. They were asked to plant two batches of marigold seeds. Both batches were given exactly the same amount of light, warmth, water, etc. The only difference was that one batch was also given love; students "sent" thoughts they considered to represent love to the plants. The plants given this extra "ingredient" grew much bigger and stronger, with bigger flowers than the control plants. The students simply brought out that which was innate in them!

The other factor which makes the programme unique is the Guided Light Visualisation. Sri Sathya Sai Baba gave this as a simple and safe meditation beneficial to anyone regardless of class, creed, colour or age. Whilst different forms of silent sitting are employed by other programmes, this form is unique to SSEHV. Light creates unity across all beings and all of creation; light is projected from the heart of one to the many.

This is just a small taster of the different aspects of the SSEHV Foundation Course. To learn more why not sign up to attend one of the up-coming courses? It is a great way to share with like minded individuals and to also equip yourself to help children bring out all their inherent values. Who knows, you could even start a Human Values club in your locality, truly showing ed-YOU-care!

The Ashram has received a number of requests by many countries to travel to Prashanti during the month of August. This is because of the school summer holidays. Many people are therefore eager to have Bhagawan's special darshan this year as they may be unable to travel for the 85th Birthday in November. United Kingdom has kindly been asked to be flexible and understanding whilst the Ashram tries to meet the wishes of the devotees. Therefore, in order to assist the Ashram, our Pilgrimage will now be from 31st July - 7th August. Accommodation in Prashanti will commence from 30th July and we will need to vacate the Ashram by 7th August (anytime after evening darshan) as another big group will be arriving on the morning of 8th August. Please could you ensure that your arrangements reflect this change in dates.

Sri Sathya Sai Charitable Trust "Behind the Scenes"

Like any other charity there are numerous audits that must be satisfied to keep the right side of the law! Recently the Trust has successfully completed two key audits - one financial the other on insurance. Independent financial auditors crawled over donations, grants and a wide range of documents before approving the annual trustees report and accounts (see www.charity-commission.gov.uk charity number 278481 for graphical presentations). Similarly the insurers visited the Sathya Sai Centre in Leicester and put forward nine actions to comply. These are as diverse as child protection arrangements, asbestos, lightning conductor and electrical surveys to boiler and fire alarm maintenance contracts. The Trust has two employees at Sathya Sai Centre (Vinod Chauhan and Vinod Patel) who carry out this wide range of things required to keep a busy building running smoothly. With their "behind the scenes" support we hope it can become a showcase for the Sri Sathya Sai Service Organisation in the UK."

Maha Shivarathri and Ekadashinee Rudra Homam Region 1 (London - South East & West)



On the 16th of February 2010 Regional Shivarathri Celebrations were held at the Sai Mandir in Wimbledon hosted by Merton Sai Centre. The auspicious occasion of Shivarathri commenced at 8:00pm. with the invocation prayers followed by Linga Abhishekam on Lingams materialised by Bhagavan Baba and the mantra Aum Sri Sai Lingeshwarya Namah was chanted by the devotees 108 times.

The Abhishekam was performed in between the Bhajans at 12.00pm, 3.00am and at 5.00am. The Bhajans were started by a mixture of adults, youth and children and then the SSE children from various centres joined up until 10:00pm. Centres from around the region conducted the Bhajans according to their time slots through out the night. Bhajans concluded with Aarthi at 6:00am

At 9:00 A.M. the Ekadashinee Rudra Homam began with a procession. During the procession Vedic mantras were chanted, generating a strong vibrant atmosphere. The priests then began with an invocation of Lord Ganapathy to remove obstacles and to give them the knowledge and the wisdom to carry out the Homam without making any errors or causing any offence.

Following this Dr Mahesh Narayan expounded on the significance of Lord Rudra, Shree Rudram and the Homam. The day continued with the priest lighting of the fire to start the Homam, and the Sai students and Ritwicks chanted sections of Shree Rudram. At intervals Bhajans, Theverams, Caranatic devotional songs, and instrumental pieces were performed. Towards the end the Saieshwara Homam was carried out, and the Sai Gayatri was chanted. The Homam concluded with all praying for forgiveness for any mistakes in their rituals or in chanting carried out whether knowingly or unknowingly.

The day's proceedings ended with Bhajans which

Dana Gillespie joined in with (following rehearsals for the Youth Choir that had been going on in the upstairs hall), and Prasadam was served. We would like to take this opportunity to thank our dear Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba for making this day possible. I'm sure all who attended will agree it was a divine and blessed experience.




Annual Regional Conference Region 6 (South England)

Book Review of the Month



Sri B.N. Narasimhamurthy, known to many as "warden-sir" due his well known role as Warden of the Hostel at Brindavan, gave many talks to the Sai Youth of Kerala during the Kerala New Year festival. Sri Narasimhamurthy beautifully brought together, edited compiled these talks into an extremely useful book for Sai Youth on pursuing the path of sadhana (or spiritual effort), as founded on the teachings of Sathya Sai Baba. Hence, the title, Helpline on the Sathya Sai Path. this volume Narasimhamurthy opens ingeniuously, sharing his own question and answer session with Swami, Immortal Answers to a Mortal's Questions:

"Swami said yesterday that a devotee on the path of sadhana (spiritual effort) should not be satisfied with himself till God tells him, "I am pleased with you; you are Mine."

This is physically possible only when the Avatar is on the earth. This is not possible in the case of devotees who are physically away from Swami. When the Avatar is not here on the earth, how can this happen?

(Swami replies) God's voice can be heard by man in his own heart irresepective of whether there is an Avatar on the earth or not. God's appreciation can also come to man in the form of some sign or as an inner experience where God's approval is felt. More than this, each aspirant can introspect as to whether he is practising qualities dear to God. If he is practising such virtues, he will experience self-

satisfaction as a result of approval from God who is the resident of his own heart. When one does not have self satisfaction, there is no question of God being satisfied with him".

This book is entirely set up in question and answer form, the questions and answers being grouped into general topic areas spread over 15 chapters. There is a good glossary included.

I cannot but emphasise that this book is compiled from the questions of young people and reflects their concerns in following the spiritual path in this—the world of the ipod, the cell-phone, television, computer gaming and all the distractions of the advertising billboards. The sincere, pure desire to negotiate this modern life dedicated utterly to the spiritual path is evident right from the first. The illustrations depict many family situations, along with other, ordinary situations in life.



Buddha used to keep with him always a rattle-drum. His disciples once asked him: "Master! Why are you always keeping this rattle-drum by your side?" Buddha replied: "I shall play on this drum the day a person who has made the greatest sacrifice approaches me." Everyone was eager to know who this person would be. Wishing to attain this distinction, a Maharaja loaded his elephants with considerable treasure and went to Buddha. He hoped to offer the treasure to Buddha and earn his praise.

On the way, an old woman greeted the Maharaja and pleaded: "I am hungry. Will you give me some food?" The Maharaja took out a pomegranate fruit from his palanquin and gave it to the old woman. The old woman came to Buddha with the fruit.

By then, the Maharaja had also come to Buddha and was eagerly waiting to see when Buddha would sound the rattle-drum. For a long time Buddha did not use it. The Maharaja stayed on.
